#### **Student Direct Costs**

Our school operates a Student Direct Costs system. This means that all book rental, insurance, journal, copying, materials are costed and an annual payment of €240 is required. #### 4th Year Biology

The aim in 4<sup>th</sup> Year Biology was to develop students' scientific writing skills. Students could:

- (a) vary the liquids used and investigate if the number of drops of different liquids would change using the same sized coin or
- (b) use the same liquid and change the size of the coin to see if the surface area will change the number of drops that will fit on the coin.



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Some students carried out extension exercises whereby they calculated the density of each liquid and commented on this in their findings. It was called the liquid drop challenge. The two 4<sup>th</sup> Year Biology classes presented their findings, and their results are posted on the science laboratory wall.

## Uniform: Did you know?

School uniform plays a key role in **promoting pride**, **self-confidence**, **and a feeling of belonging within the student body**. These factors contribute to students' wellbeing, removing the additional pressures of deciding what to wear and added stress of meeting the expectations of their peers.
