Use of E scooters

'We are aware that there is an increased use of students arriving to school on e scooters. Legislation is promised this year by the Minister for Transport, Eamon Ryan TD to enact regulation of e scooters and similar devices. We want to make parents aware that if there is an incident involving injury or damages to another person or their property whilst your child is driving end route whilst on an e scooter to school there may be a consequence to you as a parent legally. Whilst on the school premises, any student arriving to school on a scooter or similar device must switch the device off before entering the gates/entrance and carry the device whilst on the schools premises.
