Athletics - North Leinster Championships 2023

Over fifty-six students competed in the Athletics North Leinster Championships for the school on Wednesday 26th April. Our numbers partaking in Athletics is growing each year. It took place in Tullamore. We had students from every year group on the team. These were the qualifiers for the Leinster Championships which will take place later in May. There were medals won in seventeen events.

Nelson Akubuko in first year won Gold in the Minor Boys High Jump. The Minor Boys 4×100m Relay squad stormed to gold with a brilliant run. There was a relay bronze for the Intermediate Boys Relay team. Well done, to Fahd Nii-Adjei Monney, Frank Obi, Gerard Chikodzera and James Oluwatomide Obisan. A great final. Gytis Kuckailis won a silver medal in the Shot Putt Senior Boys and Gytis was another qualifier for the Leinster Schools.

Cara Miele is a double silver medallist. High Jump and Triple Jump silver at the North Leinster School's Athletics. The Senior Boys relay team qualified for the Leinsters with a silver medal in the 4x100m Relay. Jonathan Gibson won a silver medal in the Junior Boys Pole Vault. There was a silver medal for Dan Maruhin in the Senior Boys Discus. James Obisan ran brilliantly to win a bronze in the Inter Boys 100m. Senior Boys 100m bronze medallist winner was Manny Ojo in his final year of North Leinster Schools Athletics. There was a sprint double in the Minor Boys 100m. Fikayo Oluajo won a gold and Goodluck Kamgba with Bronze. Senior Boys Javelin, Darragh Quinn won silver and Lochlann Mattison won bronze. Josephine Fagbemi won a bronze in the Junior Girl's Shot Putt with a throw of over 9m. There was also a gold medal by Success Oluwatoyin Joshua in the Junior Boys Triple Jump.




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Need more information deciding on Leaving Cert Languages?

<u>Pillar Project 6-week Supporting Children's Needs when Parents Separate Summer</u> <u>Course starting 8th May 2023</u>

The Pillar Project is running a 6-week Supporting Children's Needs when Parents Separate Summer Course starting on Monday the 8th of May at 7.00 pm facilitated by Andrea Napier. The course will run every Monday evening at 7.00 pm until the 12th of June.

In this programme parents who are parenting post separation or are planning to separate are supported to firstly understand the impact of separation on children. The programme aims to support parents to have a child centred approach post separation, ensuring children are supported to manage the transition well, achieving positive outcomes. Parents are asked to explore and understand the needs of children and parents at the time of separation and how these needs can be met.

In the programme parents are encouraged to have pride in the new family form, inviting children to ask questions and being available to answer the awkward questions about family forms as they arise. We explore what shared parenting is, why it is beneficial to children when done well and how parents can develop a shared parenting plan to support them to move into the business of shared parenting post separation.

Finally, the programme asks you to develop new family traditions to support you as move through this transition with your children, while also exploring how you can manage conflict in the future while maintaining a healthy balance of meeting your needs and those of your children.
